CHILDREN OF ABRAHAM HIGH SCHOOL Objectives

Students will:

- 1. Create a PowerPoint presentation about three monotheistic religions (Judaism, Christianity, Islam) ("Abrahamic Faiths"):
 - a. Historical events, including the rising action and fall of each Abrahamic Faith.
 - b. Timeline to recognize the relationships between the Abrahamic Faiths.
 - c. Include at least three textual evidences from the following: Torah, Bible, Quran ("Holy Books").
- 2. Diagram the comparisons and contrasts of the Abrahamic Faiths (see attached)
- 3. Prepare a speech based on facts and historic details of the three monotheistic religions.
- 4. Recommend an independent reading book to another classmate with a one paragraph written review of the book.
- 5. Write a research paper based on one of the topics listed below.

Research Topics

- 1. What are the early societies of Arabia?
- 2. What does the term "Abrahamic Faiths" mean?
- 3. What are the moral and ethical guidelines of the monotheistic religions?
- 4. What are the views of the individual and social life of the Abrahamic Faiths?
- 5. What are the conflicts and resolutions of the monotheistic religions?
- 6. What are the major reasons for Abrahamic Faiths to still exist and have a huge following?

7. What is the history of Tigris and Euphrates rivers in Mesopotamia?




Learning Goals
